TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE WORKSHOP ON DYNAMIC WEB SITE DESIGN

Introduction

This workshop takes place within the framework of FSP 2004-9 project activities. This project is set to bring support to ECOWAS Member States in the process of regional integration in western Africa in the process of data exchange and statistical information dissemination.

In that line, AFRISTAT is providing a platform for Internet management building activities in National Offices of Statistics (NOS) of ECOWAS Member States with the object of facilitating the effective use of Web sites in the process of data exchange and statistical information dissemination.

- Introduction to PHP
- installation of XampServer for practical purposes
- introduction to MySQL and SQL queries
- Introduction to Joomla
- Building a dynamic website using Joomla
- Practical works

- A capacity for each participant to create a dynamic web site using Joomla;
- A capacity for each participant to publish and update information on the web site;
